



National History Day: Regional Competition at Colorado College

Since 2011, the Old North End Neighborhood (ONEN) has participated in the Regional Competition of National History Day. Each year students in both the junior (grades 6-8) and senior divisions (grades 9-12), select a historic topic to investigate within an annual theme. Using research and critical thinking skills, students must justify both the significance of their topic and its influence on history. All entries must include a title page, a process paper, and an annotated bibliography. Due to the number of contest categories (9), ONEN judges focus only on "Performance." Using props and a script, dramatic portrayals, both Individual and group, must include accurate historical information and meet a variety of other criteria. Each year, first, second and third place winners are invited to compete at the state competition in Denver. Two of these award winners go forward to the national competition at the University of Maryland.

The Old North End Neighborhood joins others who provide Special Awards in support of education. Among those who provide special awards are the Pioneers Museum (The Marshall and E.J. Sprague Scholarship), American Association of University Women (American Women in History Awards) and the Old North End Neighborhood (Special Recognition for Excellence).
